Good Shepherd Church Council met on May 18, 2025 after the worship service. Those in attendance were: Brian Walker, Linda Boxdorfer, Larry Hill, Heidi Baca, Johannah Pollert, Pat Haugh, Pastor Daene, Randy Powers, Troy Johnson, Kevin Weber and Rose Krimmel. Those absent were Doug Stahl.

The meeting was called to order at 11:20 a.m. by Brian and he asked Pastor to say a prayer.

Johannah presented the March minutes and after being reviewed they were approved.

Rose presented the Financial Income report stating in April our Offerings and other income was \$17,498.77.

Larry, Treasurer presented April's expenses as \$19,713.65.

Pastor reported the average attendance for April was 56. He officiated 4 services; had 8 Bible studies; did 3 visits; 2 hospital visits; 4 counseling sessions; made 2 Shut -in visits and had 2 Confirmation classes.

Kevin, Deacons stated the doorbells are installed and he will print a sign to put on the doors letting people know the doors are locked during the service and they need to ring the bell to enter.

Troy, Trustees, carpets from roof leaks were cleaned on April 4th. Water testing was done on March 26 for 1st quarter. Outside cameras will be installed as weather permits. Roof is being inspected week of May 19. Grass mowing schedule has been posted for 2025. A new clean up list will be posted this week.

Heidi, Christian Education reported that VBS will be June 13-15 this year. Rachel is in charge of it. All children are invited to attend.
